Financial matters

Setting up the school involved considerable financial sacrifice by the directors who continue to put in a great deal of their own time without payment. The school is now financially balanced in that income from all sources within Uganda (school fees plus donations from the directors/others) just about equals that of day to day expenditure.

The school directors are committed to transparency for all outside donors and welcome annual independent audits. Dr Stuart Creed visits the school at least annually where he carries out the annual audit.
